## Announcement of Scholarships for Studies in India for Academic Year 2021 - 22

The Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), Government of India, is pleased to announce Thirty (30) Scholarships for Nationals of Fiji under the General Scholarship Scheme (GSS) at Indian Universities / Institutes in the academic year 2021 - 22. The admission applications for interested students are invited online through ICCR online A2A (Admission to Alumni) portal link:- <a href="http://a2ascholarships.iccr.gov.in">http://a2ascholarships.iccr.gov.in</a>.

ICCR also announces One Hundred (100) scholarships Globally under the "ICCR Scholarship Scheme for Indian Culture" for pursuing study of Indian Culture such as dance, music, theatre, performing art, sculpture, Indian languages, Indian cuisine, etc. for the academic year 2021 - 22.

Interested applicants are advised to visit the University / Institute website and do a thorough research of courses offered, eligibility criteria and general information about the University / Institute, before applying for admission. The applicant should ensure that they are eligible for the course and meet the eligibility criteria.

These scholarship slots include **return economy class airfare** to the **nearest airport and 3rd A/C Train fare** to the place of study, if so required.

The **minimum age** of the applicant should be **18 years** at the time of admission and **not more than 30 years**.

A compulsory personal medical insurance is a mandatory requirement for availing of ICCR's Scholarship.
